Reflection taken from Cafod Children's Liturgy



Christ Jesus, you returned to give your disciples courage and strengthen their faith. Make us brave and help us to believe in you, so that we may care for all our brothers and sisters around the world.

Amen.

After Jesus had died and risen again, the disciples were out fishing in their boat, when Jesus appeared on the beach. They hadn't managed to catch anything, so Jesus told them to throw out their net again. This time they managed to catch lots and lots of fish. The disciples headed back to the beach and they shared some breakfast with Jesus. How do you think the disciples felt about seeing Jesus again and spending time with him? How do you feel when you see someone you haven't seen for ages?

Sitting together with others to eat is a great way to get to know or catch up with people and can be lots of fun. Can you think of a time when you have sat with others to eat a meal? Who was there? And what did you do? Did you eat in silence? Or did you spend time talking to each other? Did you share the same food?

All around the world people come together to eat and share food with each other. Karen is 10 and lives in El Salvador. She eats dinner with her family at six o'clock every day. They eat tortillas, eggs, beans and soft cheese.

As we sit together and eat with others this week, let's think about all the other people around the world who are doing the same thing.

And let's also think about all those people who do not have enough food to eat and what we can do to make sure that everyone has their fair share of food.

Friday Morning Reading Session



From the time your child is born, reading out loud is a positive influence. As your child grows, daily reading will help the brain make connections between the written and spoken word, widening vocabulary in the process.

Adding to that benefit, vocabulary knowledge equates to masterful spelling. In fact, reading, spelling and vocabulary are critically important to a child's lifelong achievement.

Parents/carers are invited to attend the Friday morning reading sessions in Reception and Key Stage 1 classes, between 8:45 and 9:00.

As you can see the children are enjoying having their parents share a book with them in school.

Did you know that if a student reads for 20 minutes each day at home they are exposed to 1.8 million words a year?

Visitors to the School



Staying Safe on-line

- Don't post any personal information online – like your address, email address or mobile number.
- Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you've put a picture of yourself online most people can see it and may be able to download it, it's not just yours anymore.
- Keep your privacy settings as high as possible
- Never give out your passwords
- Don't befriend people you don't know
- Don't meet up with people you've met online. Speak to your parent or carer about people suggesting you do
- Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are
- Think carefully about what you say before you post something online
- Respect other people's views, even if you don't agree with someone else's views doesn't mean you need to be rude
- If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website, turn off your computer if you want to and tell a trusted adult immediately.
